

Recently we issued updates for the Jemena Operation and Construction Field Manuals.



# Thought of the Month

# PPE is the last line of protection between the person and a potential hazard

The NSW WHS Act 2011 addresses the "Duty of Care" of all employers. An important aspect of this is the need for employers to provide adequate Personal Protection Equipment (PPE), and whatever else is necessary on any work-site to ensure that the risk of injury to those working on or, visiting the work-site is eliminated, by good Health & Safety Management Practice.

All personnel on a work site are personally responsible at law to ensure they properly use Personal Protective Equipment

PPE is the last line of protection between the person and a potential hazard. Prior to utilising any PPE it must be thoroughly examined by the user to satisfy themselves that it is both functional and appropriate for the task being undertaken. Where there is any doubt direction must be sought from the immediate supervisor/manager.

#### It is important that you ensure the following PPE is worn at all times where required;

#### Clothing

All persons, (including visitors) entering the work-site are expected to wear appropriate clothing when entering a work-site. "Appropriate" shall take into consideration all relevant factors, including inclement weather (including sun), workplace hazards, etc.

#### **Head Protection**

All persons (including visitors) entering the work-site, that is, enters a designated "hard hat" area, shall wear a safety helmet complying with Australian Standard 1800-1981 and 1801-1981. Providing that overhead activities are not in progress, hard hats are not required.

#### **Footwear**


All persons shall wear steel-capped safety footwear approved in accordance with Australian Standard, AS 2210-1980, and must be in good condition at all times.

#### Eye protection

- All persons performing any activity which may cause an injury to the eyes must wear approved
  eye-protection in the form of safety glasses, goggles, or face shields, as appropriate
- All persons while grinding, cutting, or drilling must wear approved safety goggles This includes personnel assisting in any of these activities;

#### **Hand Protection**

- Gloves shall not be worn when using or when near any person using power tools, machinery or equipment that has moving components.
- Gloves of suitable type shall be worn when handling metal, hot objects, welding etc. where injury
  to the hands could occur.


