#### **Directors Note**

But more importantly I ask that you all take some accountability for your communication within your own areas and teams, it's part of looking out for your fellow workers and your own safety.

Finally, I am pleased to share some great news with you all, we have been working with AGL for some time now in relation to their Energy Services division. We have now signed off on terms for a Cooperation Agreement between us, which will see Macarthur Gas manage the Energy Services business for NSW and ACT. Energy Services may be better known to some of you as "AGL Industrial and Commercial Service" we hope this is the beginning of a relationship with AGL that will prove valuable to both businesses and extend into further opportunities.

Please take care and remain alert as we move into the winter, remember the impact of cold, wet and shorter days when doing your risk assessment and driving.


